12 Car Championship Regulations 2016/17

1. It is intended the championship will run from September to the end of March. (this may be extended if the weather prohibits the normal running of an event)
2. All competitors must be fully paid members of Malton Motor Club prior to the start of the event for which they wish to claim points. Club membership numbers must be entered onto the entry form and club cards shown at documentation. Membership is an important issue, which affects the insurance of the event and will not be taken lightly if abused.
3. There will be three Championship classes – Experts, Novices and Beginners. Before the start of the season the Club Committee and Championship Coordinator will assign all prospective competitors a class for the respective roles. Anyone joining the championship midway through the season will be assigned a class prior to their first event. New competitors may be asked to provide details of previous experience/results on road rallies and 12 cars. Once assigned a class competitors will remain in that class for the duration of the season. If a competitor does not agree with the class they are assigned they may appeal in writing to the club committee. When assigning classes the decision of the Championship Coordinator is final.
4. The dropped score system will be brought into play when five or more 12 Car Rallies are run during a season. Each competitor may drop their worst score at the end of the season.
5. In the event of a championship tie, the winner will be the one with the greater number of highest scores and, if there is still a tie, then the greater number of next highest scores and so on.
6. It is the event organiser's responsibility to submit a full set of results to the championship co-ordinator not more than seven days after the event.
7. The current championship table will be published on Malton Motor Club's web site.
8. Protests and queries must be made to the championship co-ordinator no more than fourteen days after the published results.
9. Protests and queries will be decided between the championship co-ordinator and the event organiser. If a member is not satisfied with the result they may appeal to the committee, whose decision is final.
10. Trophies and replicas will be presented at the annual dinner. The trophies will remain the property of the club and will be kept by the recipient for one year. A competitor may not win more than one award.
